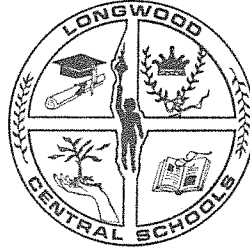

Dear Senior,

This is the letter you have been waiting for! It is time for you to request a parking space for the 2020-2021 school year. Registration will be held according to the schedule below:

You may apply for a parking permit if you are a **senior** who possesses a valid New York State Class D license. Along with the enclosed agreement, bring **original** copies of the following to Room 1105:

- New York State Class D **senior*** license
- New York State registration only – no out of state vehicle
- Current proof of insurance
- 2 Photos of vehicle(s) showing color, front/back and license plate

You may submit this form online or we will be open to receive your application only from August 11 through August 13 from 8:30 a.m. until 12:00 noon. On Tuesday, August 11 – last names starting with “A” through “I” will be accepted. On Wednesday, August 12 – last names starting with “J” through “R” will be accepted. On Thursday, August 13 – last names starting with “S” through “Z” will be accepted. Parking assignments will be on a lottery basis and will be assigned starting the week of August 31. Parking stickers will be mailed home.

On an ongoing basis, we will be reviewing attendance, lateness, cutting, grades and discipline records for all students who are granted parking privileges. Students who fail to comply with the school's policies and procedures, as outlined in the *District's Code of Conduct* and the *Student/Parent Handbook*, may have their parking privileges revoked. Also, all students must park in assigned areas. Failure to cooperate with requests from Security will result in immediate disciplinary action.

Please note, as specified in the Student/Parent Handbook, *any Senior who had 40-or-more absences during Junior Year is not eligible for Senior Parking*. Remember, Senior Parking is a PRIVILEGE, not a RIGHT and is not GUARANTEED!

LONGWOOD HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT PARKING RULES

I am requesting a permit to park at Longwood Senior High School during the 2020-2021 school year. My initials after each of the following indicates that I understand, agree to, and have fulfilled the necessary requirements as listed below:

1. I am a 12th grader expecting to graduate in January 2021 or June 2021. _____
2. I possess a valid New York State driver's license (**Class D**), as mandated by the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law. _____
3. The vehicle must be currently registered with the Department of Motor Vehicles. _____
4. The vehicle must be insured as required by the Vehicle and Traffic Law in NYS. _____
5. The vehicle must have a valid inspection sticker. _____
6. The **maximum** driving speed on school property is **5 m.p.h.** _____
7. Neither the student nor the vehicle may leave the school grounds without permission of the driver's parent and the school administration (**note: required confirmation by telephone will be made to the parent/guardian**). The student driver must stop and show the security guards an authorized pass signed by a school administrator. _____
8. Vehicles may **not** be driven by a person, other than the authorized student, while on school grounds. _____
9. No vehicle may be used during the day for any reason without permission of the administration. Books must be placed in school lockers and **not left in vehicles**. Permission to retrieve them during the school day will be denied. _____
10. All students must park in the assigned slot in the student parking area. _____
11. All students must follow the directions of the Longwood Staff; yield to all pedestrians and school buses, and stop at all STOP signs/locations in the student lot. _____
12. Parking permits will be revoked at any time, without appeal, for not complying with conditions stated regarding misconduct. _____
13. Careless driving, as well as failure to use seat belts on school property, is cause for immediate revocation. _____
14. I hereby consent to the search of the vehicle by school administration officials in the event said officials reasonably believe that the vehicle contains illegal property, property used in connection with an offense determined to be contrary to the Student Code of Conduct, and/or contains any other property which may threaten the health, safety and/or welfare of student/staff, or which may disturb the orderly operation of the School District. _____
15. All students must exercise caution and be aware of oncoming traffic when entering and exiting the assigned slot. _____
16. When exiting the student lot, students should use the student crosswalk to go to the building. _____

Long Island junior driver license restrictions [1]

Except in certain circumstances ([listed below](#)), if you have a junior license (Class DJ, MJ or DJ/MJ) you can drive in Nassau and Suffolk counties only under the direct supervision of your

- parent
- guardian ¹
- a person "in loco parentis" ²
- person authorized by your parent, guardian or person in a position of "in loco parentis" to be your supervising driver in writing
- driver education teacher or a driving school instructor

It is **also required** that

- the person who supervises your driving be at least age 21 and have a license valid for the vehicle you are driving
- the only passenger in the front seat be your supervising driver
- there be no more than one passenger under age 21 unless the passengers are members of your immediate family. You can have more than one passenger under age 21 only if your supervising driver is your licensed parent, guardian, person in a position of "in loco parentis," driver education teacher or driving school instructor
- every passenger wear a seat belt (one seat belt per person)
- all children under age four ride in federally-approved child safety seat
 - if the child is more than 40 pounds in weight, they must use a proper child restraint system such as a booster seat
 - until their 8th birthday, children must use a proper child restraint system
 - children more than four feet nine inches tall are allowed to use a seat belt and shoulder harness

When can I drive without a supervising driver?

Daytime exceptions (5 AM to 9 PM)

If you have a **junior license** (Class DJ, MJ or DJ/MJ), you may drive in Nassau and Suffolk counties between the hours of *5 AM and 9 PM* without a supervising driver only directly between your home and

- your employment (you must carry appropriate proof of employment) ³
- a state-approved cooperative work-study educational program
- an approved program for credit in a post-secondary institution
- a state-approved registered evening high school
- while engaged in farm employment
- an approved driver education course

Nighttime exceptions (9 PM to 5 AM)

Between the hours of 9 *PM* and 5 *AM*, you may drive in Nassau and Suffolk counties without a supervising driver only *directly* between your home and

- a state-approved cooperative work-study educational program
- an approved program for credit in a post-secondary institution
- a state-approved registered evening high school
- while engaged in farm employment
- an approved driver education course

What are the penalties for traffic violations as a junior driver?

Your junior permit, license, or privileges will be suspended for 60 days if you are convicted of one serious traffic violation or two other violations that were committed while you held a junior permit or license.

Your junior permit, license, or privileges will be revoked for 60 days if you are convicted of one serious traffic violation or two other violations within the first six months after your permit, license or privileges are restored after a suspension or revocation.

A "serious traffic violation" is normally a violation that carries three or more driver violation points. ^[2]

What are the penalties for conviction of cell phone use or texting as a junior driver?

If you have a Class DJ or MJ driver license or learner permit, the first conviction of a cell phone use or texting violation will result in a suspension of your driver license or permit for 60 days. (For texting/cell phone violations committed between July 1, 2013 and October 31, 2014)

A second conviction within six months will result in

- a revocation of at least 6 months of a probationary license, or
- a revocation of at least 60 days for a Class DJ or MJ driver license or learner permit

Effective November 1, 2014, the first conviction of a cell phone use or texting violation will result in a suspension of the driver license or permit for 120 days.

A second conviction within six months of the restoration of the license or permit (after the 120 day suspension is terminated) will result in

- a revocation of at least one year of a probationary license, or
- a revocation of at least one year for a Class DJ or MJ driver license or learner permit

- 1 "guardian" means a person who has, on a regular and extended basis, assumed the character of your parent and is discharging parental duties as the result of the death, disability, or absence of your natural parent.
 - 2 "in loco parentis" means a person who has, on a regular and extended basis, assumed the character of your parent and is discharging parental duties as a result of the death, disability, or absence of your natural parent.
 - 3 "employment" means a place of business at which you are paid to work on a regularly scheduled basis. You may NOT drive during work or as part of your work duties, such as for deliveries. Driver must also have in their possession a filled out Certificate of Employment (pdf) ^[3] (MV-58A).
